

PLEASE NOTE: B triangles are shown using (2) fabrics. Adjust cutting according to quantity of fabrics you wish to use.



 (8) 2 7/8" squares; cut each square once diagonally to make (16) A triangles. Please note: (1) triangle will be unused. <i>Grunge #30150 101</i> (8) 2 7/8" squares; cut each square once diagonally to make (16) B triangles. (1) triangle will be unused. <i>Grunge-6 from 325 & 2 from 365</i> (1) 4 7/8" square; cut the square once diagonally to make (2) C triangles. <i>Grunge #30150 101</i>
triangles. (1) triangle will be unused. <i>Grunge-6 from 325 & 2 from 365</i> (1) 4 7/8'' square; cut the square once diagonally to make

Assembly

- Both small and large HST units are needed to create this block. Begin large HST unit assembly by placing (1) C triangle and (1) D triangle right sides together and edges aligned.
- 2. Sew along the longest edge using a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam.
- 3. Trim HST unit to measure 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " unfinished. Press toward the dark fabric.
- 4. Repeat to create (2) identical large HST units.
- Begin small HST unit assembly using the same techniques described above and (15) A and B triangles. (Please note: Diagrams and quilt block is shown using (2) small HST unit colorways.)
- 6. Trim small HST units to measure $2 \frac{1}{2}$ x $2 \frac{1}{2}$ unfinished.




- 7. Create the block stem using (1) G rectangle and (2) F triangles. Begin by pressing the F triangles and the G rectangle in half to mark the exact centers with a crease.
- 8. Line up the creased centers and sew (1) F triangle onto either side of the G rectangle.



- 9. Press triangles away from the G rectangle.
- 10. Remove excess fabric, trimming the stem to measure $4 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $4 \frac{1}{2}$ " unfinished.




- 11. Lay out all units created in the above steps, (2) E rectangles and (3) H squares as shown. Sew the block together in quadrants. Arrows indicate pressing instructions.
- 12. Sew the quadrants together to complete the block. Press to complete. Block should measure 12 1/2" x $12 \frac{1}{2}$ " unfinished.
